

## Hospitalization Guidelines

1. If you need to temporarily leave the ward after admission, please inform the nursing staff to avoid affecting your treatment. For leaving the hospital premises, you must first obtain the attending physician's approval, complete a leave application form, and register at the nursing station. For patients admitted under National Health Insurance, overnight leave is not permitted according to Article 16 of the National Health Insurance Medical Care Regulations. Patients who leave the hospital without prior approval will be regarded as having discharged themselves automatically.
2. To maintain a quiet environment and protect the rights of other patients, visiting hours are until 10:00 p.m. (indicated by the hospital's "goodnight" music). Only family members who need to accompany and care for patients may stay overnight.
3. Please help maintain a quiet environment in the ward. Do not speak loudly, so as not to disturb other patients' rest.
4. Smoking and betel nut chewing are strictly prohibited throughout the hospital.
5. For safety reasons, cooking is not allowed in the ward or bathrooms. The pantry is equipped with rice cookers for reheating food. Unauthorized electrical appliances or other hazardous items are strictly prohibited. (Please do not endanger medical care.)
6. For the safety of your belongings, please do not bring valuables to the hospital.
7. Pets are not allowed in the hospital to prevent the spread of infectious diseases and to maintain a quiet environment.
8. Patients are strictly prohibited from bringing dangerous goods or illegal items into the hospital. Violations may result in forced discharge or referral to the police.
9. **Guidelines for Companions/Visitors of Inpatients**
  - General ward companions: limited to **1 person**
  - Visitors: maximum of **2 persons**
  1. Please complete online registration or contact the nursing station in advance.
  2. If you have a fever or respiratory symptoms, please refrain from visiting the hospital to prevent infection of patients.
  3. To reduce the risk of infectious diseases, please practice good personal hygiene, including proper hand hygiene and cough etiquette.
